## LOCAL LAW NO. 001-2025

#### Grievance Day of the Town of Sidney

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF SIDNEY IN THE COUNTY OF DELAWARE, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

#### §1 Title.

This local law shall be known as the "Grievance Day of the Town of Sidney."

## § 2 Intent.

This Local Law is to provide for [the holding of Grievance Day on the second Thursday following the fourth Tuesday in May.]

#### § 3 Authority and Legislative Intent

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to Section 512 of the Real Property Tax Law. This Local Law is enacted to authorize an assessing unit that employs an assessor, who also serves elsewhere in the same capacity, to change its Grievance Day, pursuant to Section 512 (1-a) of the Real Property Tax Law.

## § 4 Definitions

As used in this Local Law, the following words shall have the following respective meanings:

A. "Grievance Day" means the date on which the Board of Assessment Review shall meet to hear complaints in relation to assessments.

#### § 5 Date Established

The Town of Sidney shall hold Grievance Day on [the second Thursday following the fourth Tuesday in May] commencing in 2025 each year thereafter.

# § 6 Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect upon it being duly filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York.

Mr. Leidy explained that he went to the Park and was able to read the meter and called NYSE&G and was able to the error corrected. He also stated that it's not a bad idea to read your own meter at time. Mr. Leidy stated that he will be happy to help the town anytime.

Dawn William President of the Prospect Hill Cemetery came before the board regarding the sidewalks located on the East Main Street side of the cemetery. The sidewalks are in bad shape and wanted to speak to the Town Board about getting help in repairing 230 feet. Ms. William stated, "Its's a matter of safety." Ms. William has received two estimates for the work that should be done. Flemvale Construction quoted \$ 16,790.00 and Clark's Construction was \$ 23,550.

Seeing the Cemetery is non-for-profit organization and relies on fundraising for repairs, was hoping that the Town would be able to help with some financial help, as the Village of Sidney would be able to contribute \$ 3,000 towards the cost.

Deputy Supervisor Mr. Selleck stated that Supervisor Mr. Wilson was unable to attend the meeting, that this topic should be tabled until next month meeting on June 12<sup>th</sup>.

Tree cutting on Poplar Hill Rd in on going in preparation for future paving. Making steady progress and are aiming to have this stage completed on schedule.

There was an incident on Pine Hill Road here a utility company, while installing underground fiber optic lines, one of the cross culverts was damaged. After a meeting with the company, they have agreed to take full responsibility for the damage and will do all the necessary repairs to my specification and satisfaction.

Operations have been running smoothly across the department. Routine maintenance and seasonal preparations are on trac, and the team is performing well.

TOWN CLERK- Sheila Paul: I attended New York State Town Clerk Association Conference and brought back some information and wants to implement into my office. Taxes are done for the year.

Water level is 29 feet about normal and could impact campers at lower campsite, he is keeping an eye on that situation. Wi-Fi is shorting out and needs to have more bandwidth, also planning on putting in two or three more cameras, so he can monitor the park when not on premises.
